The conversation ended with announcements about upcoming events including a Scouting Forward Dinner and Operation Toy Train, along with a brief discussion about sharing antenna wire and coaxial cable.

Summary

Club Officers and Events Update

The meeting covered several topics, including the distribution of shirts to members and a reminder about proper drying to prevent logo curling. Tim KD2EKN discussed the need to identify new club officers for the upcoming year, with elections scheduled in two weeks. The group also mentioned an upcoming luncheon on December 6th at the Vintage Tavern in Gillette, where awards will be presented.

Additionally, Sam KC2OSR shared that he would be delivering a card to a club member, KC2TOP, who was injured in a car accident.

Morse Code Invention Discussion

Greg Smith, W2GLS, presented a talk titled "Who Really Invented Morse Code," focusing on Alfred Vail's contributions to the development of Morse code. N2TO introduced Greg as our guest speaker. The conversation ended with W2GLS starting his slideshow presentation which was recorded on ZOOM and posted on the NPARC Reflector.

Morse Code and Alfred Vail

W2GLS discussed the history of Morse code and its inventor, Alfred Vail, and shared his research and insights on Vail's contributions, highlighting his role in developing Morse code and the telegraph. They explored Vail's background, the financial and technical challenges he faced, and the controversy surrounding the patent rights. The discussion included details about the first working telegraph prototype, the Morristown demonstration, and the lasting impact of Morse code on communication. Greg and KC2OSR added context on the choice of letters in Morse code, Greg explaining it was based on frequency of use. KA2HZP demonstrated several classic sounder keys and explained how they were used

Morse Code and Radio History

The meeting covered several topics related to Morse code, telegraphy, and amateur radio. W2GLS presented information on Morse code history, including the inventors Morse and Vail, and their contributions. Rick WB2QOQ shared memories of a 1988 special event station at Historic Speedwell commemorating the electromagnetic telegraph's anniversary. The group discussed practicing Morse code using online tools and K2CMW advertised the the weekly NPARC CW Net. KD2EKN announced two upcoming events: a Scouting Forward Dinner featuring Jeff Sestari as a speaker, and Operation Toy Train's schedule for collecting toys for charity across multiple states. The conversation ended with a brief discussion about antenna wire and coaxial cable that KC2OSR had available for sharing or recycling.

The next meeting is on Monday, November 24 at the Salt Brook School and on ZOOM. It will be our Annual Meeting and 2026 office elections will take place at the meeting.
