### 2025 Skeeter Hunt

The "Skeeter Hunt" is an annual four hour QRP operating event sponsored by the NJQRP Club each August. Operators are encouraged to get outside and operate portable with homebrewed or kit built radios.

#### Al - K2AL

I usually operate from my backyard. This year I once again used an MFJ End Fed Half Wave antenna thrown over a branch, my Elecraft K1 for 40 and 20 meters, an Elecraft T1 QRP tuner and a 12 volt battery.



I made 23 QSOs and worked 14 states and Ontario and some non-Skeeter POTA stations. It was hot, but at least the heavy rains and lightning held off until after everything was put away.

On Sunday August 17th I took part in the 4 hour NJQRP "Skeeter Hunt" signing skeeter #189. I setup in my backyard near the Passaic River with my Elecraft KX-1 and a long wire antenna with counterpoise. I made a total of 12 CW QSO's, working 9 states, mostly on solar power. Initially, my power source was the internal alkalines, but when the sun came out I removed the alkalines and switched to solar power until the sun went down.
